

GUIDE TO SIZA REGISTRATIONS

1 April 2026 – 31 March 2027

The SIZA pricing model is based on the selected modules and the required market visibility. If you are unsure which subscription level best suits your needs, we recommend contacting the SIZA office, as this choice directly affects the structure and duration of the third-party audit. Please note that SIZA offers a user-paid service to capture SAQ and audit information for Sedex, as this is a market requirement. **Sedex and GLOBALG.A.P. fees are additional to the SIZA subscription fees, and SIZA has no control over these charges or any fee increases they may implement.**

During registration, you can choose from the following options:

- SIZA Social (Ethical) Standard
- SIZA Environmental Standard
- SIZATrack360 digital recordkeeping programme = R640 for existing SIZA subscribers or R1 600 for accounts registered only for SIZATrack360
- Visibility for sharing information, maintaining your profile, and links with markets on Sedex = R3100
- Option to share visibility of your SIZA Social and/or Environmental Audit on the GLOBALG.A.P. (AGRAYA) data platform to avoid duplication of audits = R600 per module

If you decide to add additional contacts to your profile, the following is relevant per person:

- Adding a secondary contact to your primary profile (level 1a – 3) = R380
- Adding a secondary contact to your secondary profile (level 4a – 6) = R1 200
- Adding additional users to an Audit profile (level 7a – 7b) = R620 per additional person
- Adding additional users to a GHG or Consultant profile (level 7c – 8) = R640 per additional person

Please note that the definitions and costs are consistent across both the Social (Ethical) and Environmental modules, as they are distinct standards. You may register for either module individually or both together. Additionally, the Digital Recordkeeping Programme is a standalone offering and can be subscribed to independently, without requiring registration for the social or environmental standards.

Level 1a	Producer	A single production site.	R1 470
Level 1b	Producer/Packhouse/Processing Facility	A single production site including a packing/processing facility on site, packing/processing their own product.	R1 635
Level 1c	Smallholders/Emerging Growers	Producers who have <i>never undergone an audit</i> and needs to become compliant can apply to be included in the SIZA Emerging Growers Compliance Programme which runs over a 3-year period.	Support is provided with third party funding over a 3-year period after which they will graduate to level 1a once they completed a SIZA audit.
Level 1d	Temporary Employment Services (Labour Brokers)	A person or company that provides labourers to client companies on a temporary basis.	R680
Level 2	Packhouse/Processing facility	An independent packhouse/processing facility that packs/processes on behalf of primary producers.	R2 730
Level 3	Multisites/Packhouses/Processing Facilities	The multisite principle is applied where the organisation and multiple sites are registered as <u>one legal entity</u> and have one management system that is centrally controlled at a head office base.	The head office, in this case, can register as a Level 3 subscriber for R1 470 (excl. VAT) for the first site and thereafter R1 090 (excl. VAT) per additional site for the next five sites. In cases where businesses have 7 - 10 sites, there is a base fee of R1 470 (excl. VAT) for the first site and thereafter a fee of R1 000 (excl. VAT) per site applies. For 11 sites onwards, a base fee of R1 470 (excl. VAT) applies for the first site and thereafter R950 (excl. VAT) per additional site applies. In cases where there is a packhouse there is an additional fee of R1 630 (excl. VAT)

Level 5b	Minor Industry Association	Industry representing under 5 000 hectares	R5 200
Level 5c	Major Industry Association	Industry representing above 5 000 hectares	R10 500
Level 5d	Data Visibility	Secondary subscribers who require visibility on primary producers/packhouses audit data	Subscription cost is calculated based on the number of primary producers/packhouses linked for data visibility: 1 – 100 links: R31 500 101 – 250 links: R35 000 251 – 500 links: R40 000 505+ links: R50 000
Level 6	Not-for-Profit Organisation	An organisation that does not need to be linked to Level 1 – 3 sites. For example, NGO, trade union, or other non-profit entity not requiring visibility of Level 1 – 3 sites.	R1 800
Secondary Contact	All Secondary Levels (Level 4a – Level 6)	A secondary contact is an employee in your business who requires access to your MySIZA profile to also obtain visibility on linked suppliers.	R1 200 per secondary contact.
Level 7a	Social (Ethical) Audit Firms		R4 570 base fee, including R620 (excl. VAT) per Auditor, Reviewer, or Scheduler.
Level 7b	Environmental (Ethical) Audit Firms		R4 570 base fee, including R620 (excl. VAT) per Auditor, Reviewer, or Scheduler.



Level 7c	Independent Greenhouse Gas Specialists	A company that specialises in calculating a site's carbon footprint within the agricultural sector.	R4 750 base fee, including R640 (excl. VAT) per GHG Specialist or Scheduler.
Level 8	Training Service Providers/Consultants/Remedy Programmes	Companies who are recognised by SIZA and who need to be visible as recommended programmes to the producers.	R1 550 base fee, including R640 (excl. VAT) per additional consultant who needs visibility or access.

Definition of a production site?

A production "site" refers to an agricultural production or processing facility characterised by:

- permanent infrastructure supporting production and/or packing activities;
- ongoing activities warranting a permanent workforce;
- clear identification, either independently or within a group, as a distinct production unit with its management structure.

Definition of a Multisite (i.e. with a packhouse included)

In the case of multisite, the legal entity will need to declare the production units (PUCs/PHCs) to be included in the audit scope based on risk factors, including

- distance from the head office,
- detail and clarity of information submitted on the SAQ per production unit,
- size of the different production sites,
- commodities produced by production sites,
- commodities packed/processed by packing/processing facilities
- Accommodation
- If a site has more than one PUC code (In cases where orchard blocks are registered with PUC codes – please call the SIZA office to clarify)
- Subscription fees are not refundable
